Kiwanian Jay Hanley arranged for the program. He is involved with the ranch as director of advancement and church relations. He introduced **Kendra Jones** who serves as a counselor and an equine specialist.

The ranch has 18 horses and eight colts. Some are donated horses, others belong to the ranch foreman, and the speaker owns one of them.

Fun and Different Approach

Ms. Jones combines her love of children and of horses in providing the therapy. It makes for a fun and different approach to solve problems or to deal with and process past traumatic experiences. She told of a youngster who didn't communicate, but later began to open up and communicate.

She mentioned that some children ride the horses backwards or sideways. She said that Fridays are important days for the equine program. Children see horses at least once per week.

One horse was known to try to get his way ("horse bully"). A boy identified with the situation, saying he was like that horse because he had bullied others.

The children wear helmets when in the therapy sessions. The speaker said that riding is therapeutic. The equine approach is good in helping men.

Donation from Club

Kiwanis Club budgets some of its funds raised through the flag project for donation to the ranch, which serves both boys and girls. At the conclusion of the meeting, Jay Hanley was presented a check for a club gift of \$2,500 for the ranch.

The annual telethon to raise funds for the ranch is to be August 18 this year.
